Migratory birds are in trouble. We have 3 billion fewer birds in North America than we did in 1970: nearly 30 percent fewer birds. A huge factor is habitat degradation and loss. We must all replace our cultivated plants with native plants to save the birds.

The Winterberry Holly shrub (ilex verticillata) is a deciduous holly native to eastern and central United States. It will produce berries that can last all winter. "The Winterberry Shrub" is a composite artwork including just eight of the more than 40 species of birds that feed from the berries on this plant.
